Instrument: Trombone

Audition Requirements:

Trombone performers should play

- 1) required scales
- 2) their own selection from the solo repertoire
- 3) the attached required orchestral excerpts.

In addition:

Trombones should be able to read bass clef and tenor clef.

PYSB Brass Scale Requirements

Trumpet

-G major 2 octaves articulated using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM

-C major 2 octaves slurred using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM

Horn

-F major 2 octaves articulated using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM

-A major 2 octaves slurred using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM

Trombone & Euphonium

-F major 2 octaves articulated using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM

-Bb major 2 octaves slurred using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM

Tuba

-F major 2 octaves articulated using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM

-Bb major 2 octaves slurred using a rhythmic pattern of your choice quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 100 BPM
