## Philadelphia Youth Concert Band (PYCB) Auditions 2024-2025

### Instrument: Trumpet

**Audition Requirements:** All Trumpet performers will be asked to play:

- 1) Required scales
- 2) A selection of choice from the solo repertoire (see guidelines below)
- 3) Attached excerpts

In addition:

Trumpet students must have a B-flat trumpet, and if possible, have access to a C trumpet, and should be starting to learn transpositions.

**PYCB Brass Scale Requirements:** 2 major scales, using keys up to 4 flats and 4 sharps; quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

**NOTE:** All required scales are listed in the key of your instrument

**Trumpet:**

G major 2 octaves **articulated** using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

Bb major 2 octaves **slurred** using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

**Horn:**

Eb major 1 octave **articulated** using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

G major 2 octaves **slurred** using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

**Trombone & Euphonium/Baritone:**

F major 2 octaves **articulated** using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

Ab major 1 octave **slurred** using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 120 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

**Tuba:**

F major 2 octaves articulated using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.

Ab major 2 octaves articulated using a rhythmic pattern of your choice, quarter note equals 116 BPM or half note equals 80 BPM.
